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# 1.GENERALSAFETY PRECAUTIONS


The lift should only be used by properly trained personnel and only after reading and understanding this manual. The operator must be authorised by the person in charge of the plant.

Tampering with or making changes to the lift and safety devices is forbidden. Failure to comply will result in the manufacturer being released from all liability for any resulting damages. Also follow these instructions:

- only use manufacturer's accessories and spares;
- installation must be performed by authorised and professional personnel;
- make sure no hazardous situations occur during up or down movement of the lift. If they do, stop the lift immediately and remedy the causes of the emergency;
- the arms must be positioned at the vehicle points provided.

Before lifting, check vehicle stability. During up or down movement, check the vehicle load bearing point;

- standing on the lifting mechanisms is forbidden;
- after lifting, position the switch on "0";
- beforelifting, check the load is correct by means of the "load diagram" adhesive.



### 2.SAFETYDEVICES

#### 2.1Padlockablemainswitch

#### 2.2 Deadman device

The lift is equipped with a "deadman" type operative system so that the rise or descent operations are immediately stopped when the command is released.

#### 2.3 Device to prevent accidental descent

The lift is equipped with an automatically activated device. This prevents the lift descending more than 100 mm when there is a defect or leak in the hydraulic lifting circuit.

#### 2.4 Device to prevent electric overcharges

The lift is equipped with a magneto-thermal switch. The magneto-thermal switch might be disabled. This cab be manually reset inside the electric panel.

#### 2.5 Overload valve

Prevents lifting of loads exceeding lift capacity.

#### 2.6 Arm anti-rotation device




#### 7.2 Components and accessories for installation

- The lift is dispatched as shown in the illustration 1.
- Packages contain the accessories and the small parts for lift assembly completion.
- Liftingmustbedoneasshowninthe illustration 2.
- Raise with care and move the various units to the unpacking site.

#### Proceed as follows when moving the machine to the chosen installation point (or for subsequent re-positioning):

- lift with care, using suitable means of load support which are in perfect working order and using the special hooking points as shown in the illustration.
- avoid sudden jolts and pulling, watch out for uneven surfaces, bumps etc..
- take special care with outjutting parts: obstacles, difficult throughways, etc..
- wearsuitableclothingandprotectivegear.
- after removing the various packaging materials, check that these are taken to special waste collecting areas inaccessible to children andanimalswheretheywillsubsequentlybedisposedof.
- onreceivingthegoods, checkthatthe packaging has not been opened.

Once unpacked, check that nothing has been damaged.



#### 7.4Voltagecheck

Checkthatthevoltageofthesystemcorresponds to the mains voltage. If not, contact the service center.

#### 7.5 Connecting up to the mains

Anyworkinvolvingtheelectricsystem-no matterhowminor-isthejobofspecifically trainedpersonnel.

The minimum capacity required is: cable cross-section 4G2.5sq.mm.

Ifindoubt,stopinstallationandcalltechnical service. Also check that there is an automatic circuit breaker installed upstream, to safeguard against overloads, fitted with 30mA protection.

Pressthepowercablethroughthecableguideand connectthewirestoterminals1-3-5forthethree-phase version and 1-3 for the single-phase version (seeillustrationsontheside).

#### 7.6Phasesequencecheck

Ifnocarriagehasmovedafter10-15seconds,it meansthatthemotormightberunninginthe wrongdirection.Ifso,reversetwopowercables.

#### 7.7 Completion and check

- Fitthelongarms
- Fittheshortarms
- Runafewloadlessstrokesupanddownto drain any air from the circuit.

#### NOTE

Irregular motion, especially during downwards movement, is a sign of air in the hydraulic circuit.



#### 7.8 Arm stop

Once the lift is down, make sure that the arm can move freely.





#### 7.9Checkingtheoillevel

Checkthatoillevelinthecontrolunittankisatthe markAwhentheliftisfullydown.Ifnot,topup with ESSO Huto H32 oil or equally rated oil.

#### 7.10Airbleedingoutthehydrauliccircuit

Carryoutsomeidlestrokestoallowairblowing outthehydraulicsystem.

#### 7.11Dismantling

Anydismantlingoperationsperformedinorder tomove, store or scrapthemachine must be done inthereversesequencetothatfollowedfor installation.

# 8.INSTRUCTIONSFOR USINGTHELIFT

#### 8.1 Improper use of the lift

The lift is designed for lifting vehicles with the specifications described in the "Technical Details" and in the section "Intended use". Any other use is to be considered unsuitable and unreasonable. In particular, the following situations are absolutely prohibited:

- 1) lifting people or animals;
- 2) lifting vehicles with people inside;
- 3) lifting vehicles containing potentially dangerous materials carried (explosives, corrosives, inflammable substances etc).
- 4) lifting vehicles not positioned on the pickup
- 5) lifting vehicles with accessories not envisaged by themanufacturer
- 6) use of the lift by staff who are not adequately trained and authorised

#### 8.2 Use of accessories

The lift may be used with accessories to facilitate the work of the operator. Only original accessories made by the manufacturer may be used.

#### 8.3 Staff training

The equipment may only be operated by specially trained and authorised staff. To ensure that the machine is used in the best possible way and that the work can be out efficiently, the staff responsible forthemachinemustbeproperlytrainedtohandle the necessary information in order to achieve an operative method in line with the instructions supplied by the manufacturer. For any doubts concerning use and maintenance of the machine refer to the instructions manual and, if necessary, authorised technical service centres or the manufacturer, technical service department.

# 11.STORAGE

#### 11.1 Scrapping
